1 can condensed chicken soup 3 cups cooked veal, ground 2 teaspoons gelatine (softened in 2 tablespoons water) ³/₄ teaspoon salt

1/8 teaspoon pepper

Strain the chicken soup and heat the broth. Mix the rice, chicken and celery from the soup with the cooked veal and put all through the food chopper, using the medium blade.

Dissolve the softened gelatin in the hot broth and then mix with ground meat mixture, salt and pepper. Tinkan

For Garnish: 1 hard cooked egg, sliced 5 stuffed olives

Arrange slices of hard cooked egg and stuffed olives in bottom of

loaf pan (size 7 x 31/2 x 3 inches). Put meat mixture on garnish and place in the refrigerator until firm. Turn out on lettuce or greens. Serves 6-8.
