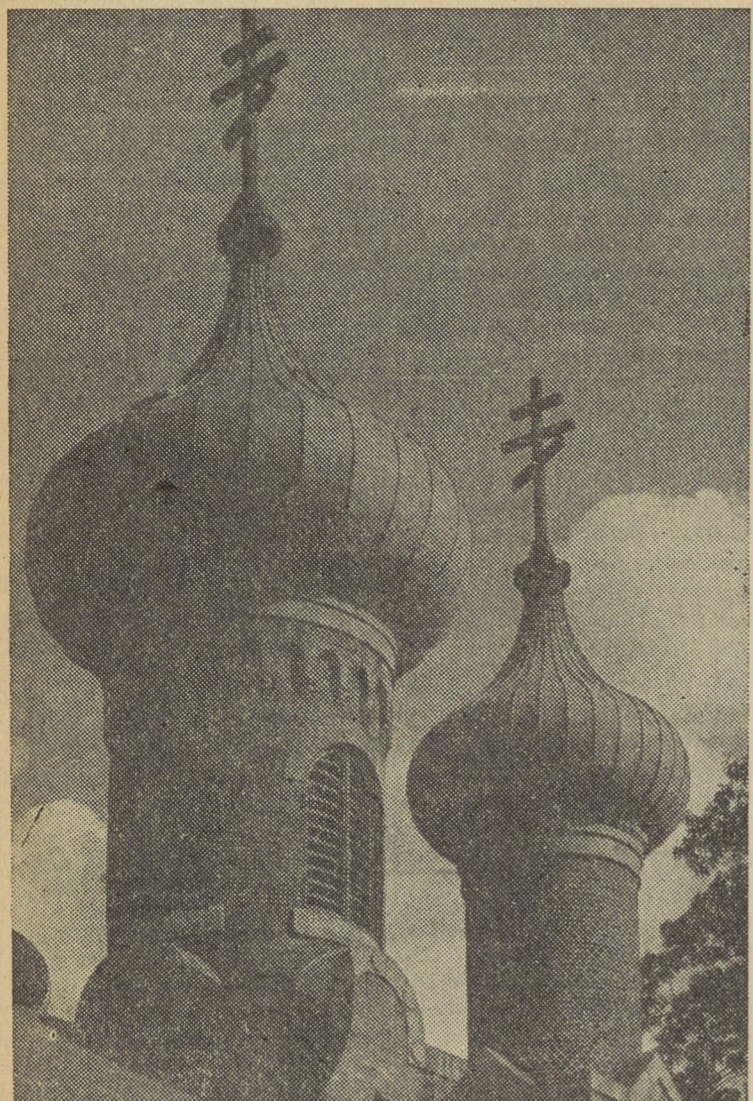


**Russian Touch on American Scene "Jingle, Jangle"**

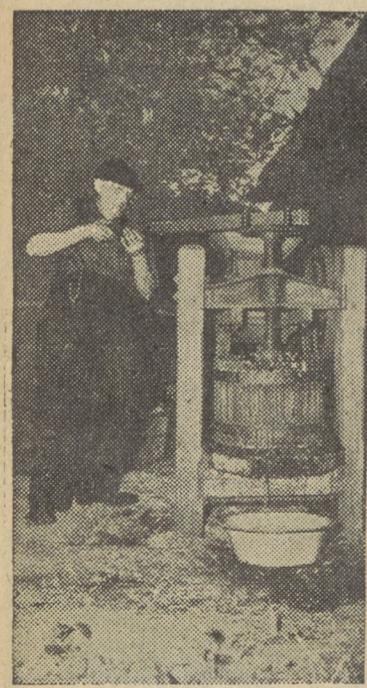
Many a hunter these days is anxiously awaiting the opening of the Pennsylvania small game season October 31. Here is a picture familiar to every man who handles a shotgun.

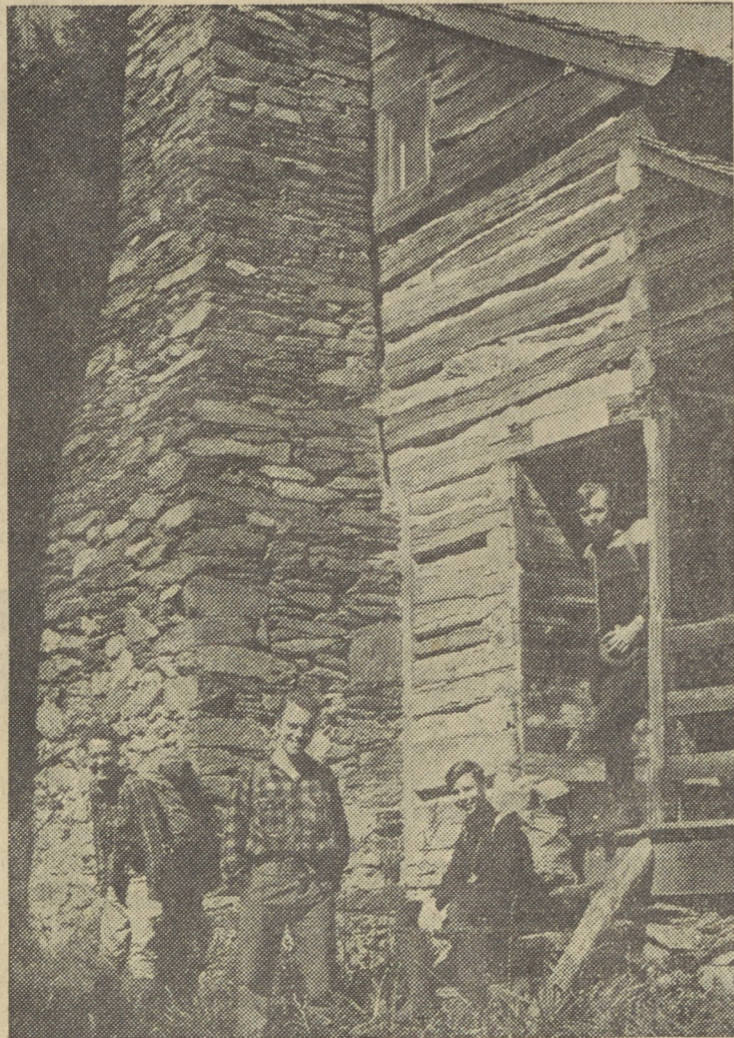
