## Save Your Tires-Save Transportation for America

Every American car owner today is a partner with the United States Government in preserving the Nation's precious stock of tires and rubber.

The tires on your car are a sacred trust. It is your duty to make them last as long as possible.

Our street cars and busses are already crowded to capacity. As one of America's 28 million car owners, it is your duty to stay off busses and street cars in going to and from work. To make certain that you do not become a street-car or bus rider, take steps now to prevent your car and tires from wearing out.

Don't drive more than 35 miles per hour. Keep your tires properly inflated. Don't skin your tires against the curb when parking. Drive around—instead of over—rough spots on the road.

Above all, form a Car Sharing Club with your neighbors and make one car do the work of four. If you cannot find four neighbors who work in the same part of town you do, ask your Civilian Defense Block Leader to assist you. All you have to do is to call, or drop in at, your local Defense Council. Your Block Leader will call on you and give you the help you need.

Your Block Leader will need to know a few basic facts your name and address, the capacity of your car, the time you leave for work each day, and the hour of returning.



He will put you in touch with neighbors who also want to form a car sharing club. Make certain each member of the club understands whose car is to be used each week.



Map out the route you will take to work. Set a definite time for leaving, and, if possible, a definite meeting place. It is important that all members be on time so as not to keep the others waiting.
