A meeting of interest to all Grangers will be held in the Jackson Grange Hall Friday evening, October 13 at 8 p. m.

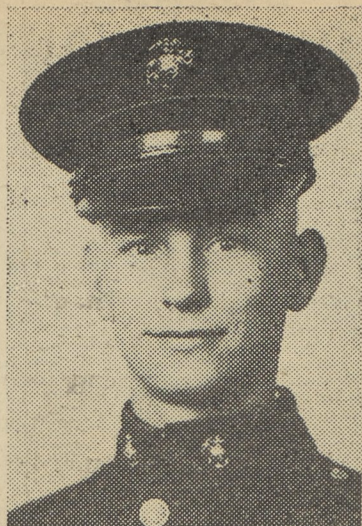

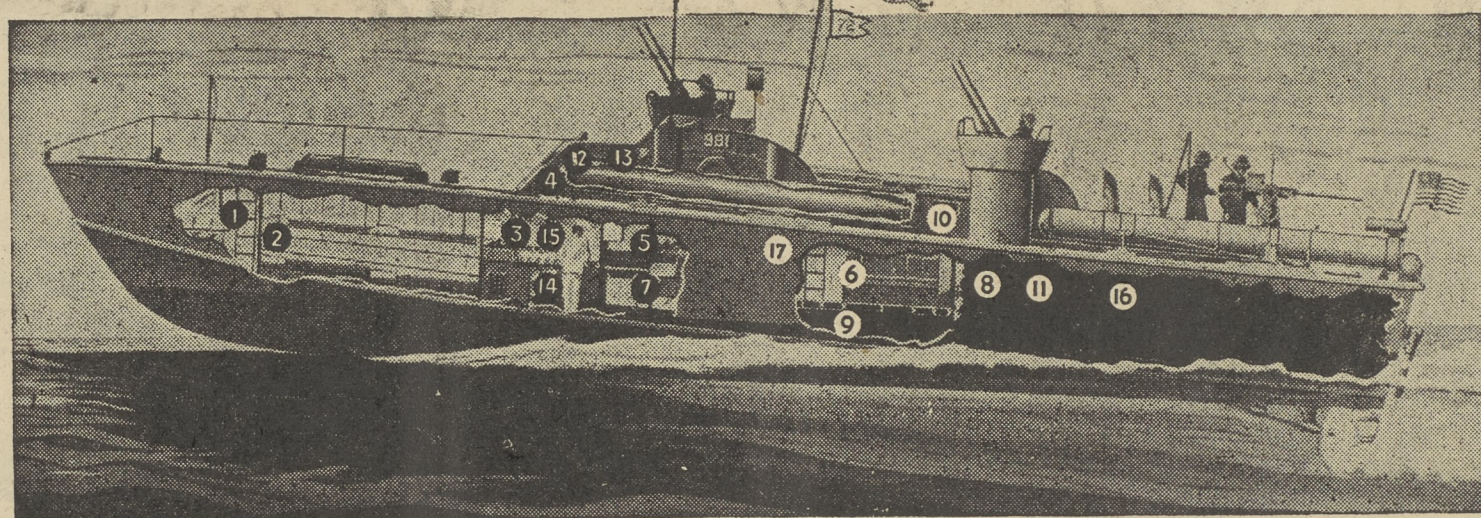
