Tunkhannock To Have New National Cemetery

A new National Cemetery will be ouilt in the Tunkhannock area, according to an announcement made Monday by the War Department. One of five planned for Pennsylvania, it will accommodate 75,000 graves.

Although the available lands in Wyoming County have been surveved by Army Engineers to determine which is most suitable, the exact location of the new project has not yet been announced.

More than 5,000,000 graves will be provided in the seventy-nine new cemeteries throughout the country proposed by the War Department. All honorably discharged veterans of any United States war, their wives or widows, and members of women's branches of the armed forces may be buried in the National Cometeries.



At the outset of our campaign for school director in Dallas Borough we want to take this opportunity to thank all of you who signed our petitions. The number who have offered us their support is most encouraging.


We want to make it clear that we ask and expect no support from any politicians or political organizations. Our whole concern is a better school system for our own children and the children of our neighbors.
