Rev. R. W. Edmundson, the pastor, extends a cordial invitation to everyone to attend this meeting.

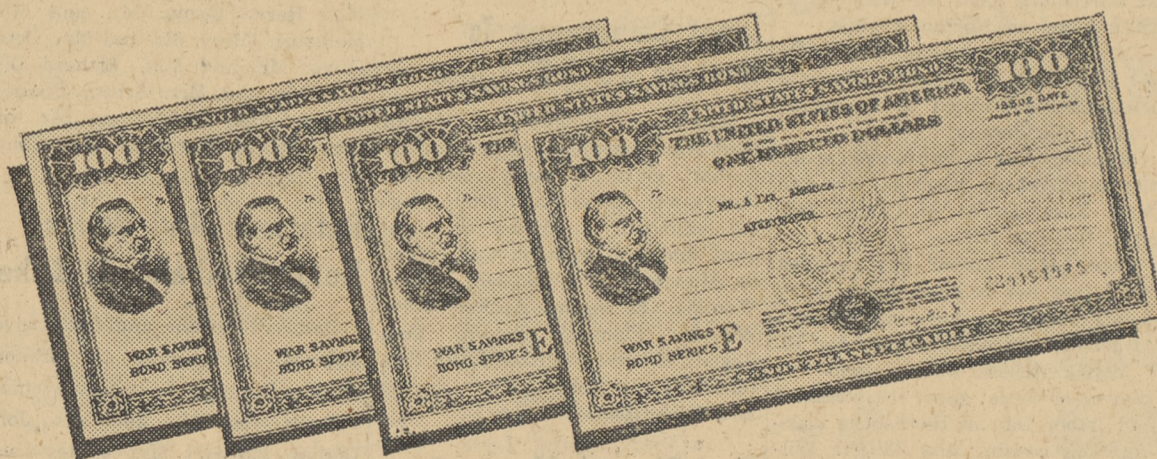
