

Agnes Berry Explains Basketball Rules To Girls' Teams At Clinic

Designed to reduce dangerous playing which might result in physical injury and to standardize officiating at girls' games, notoriously rough this year, a basketball clinic was held last Wednesday night at Kingston Township High School. Sponsored by the Back-Mountain League, it was conducted by Miss Agnes M. Berry, Wilkes-Barre, who is Wyoming Valley's foremost sports official. About one hundred coaches, referees, players and supervising principals, representing every school in the Back-Mountain, and several non-Back-Mountain guests attended.

player also gets two foul shots. On a foul try, the person shooting may elect to take the ball out of bounds instead. When the ball is not in the hands of the player, during dribbling or juggling, it is a free ball. Time is not out during a foul try in girls' games, but remains in through all the games, unless the referee stops the clock.

Following her talk, a discussion of various problems, both of referees and players, was held and many of the past disputes were settled. Each referee was given actual practice at a demonstration game that followed, in which teams from Dallas Borough, Laketon, Harter and Kingston Township participated.
