first year. About 40 percent of the help employed will be male. Although Wilkes-Barre banks have agreed to take the \$200,000 first mortgage, other banks of the area will be asked to participate. Wyoming Valley Industrial Fund assisted by Wilkes-Barre Wyoming Valley Chamber of Commerce and certain manufacturers of the area are instrumental in bringing the plant here and will work together in raising second mortgage funds throughout the community.


