Byron Ide is spending a 30-day furlough at his home on Church Road after being in South American waters for the past six months. Mrs. Charlotte Lewis celebrated

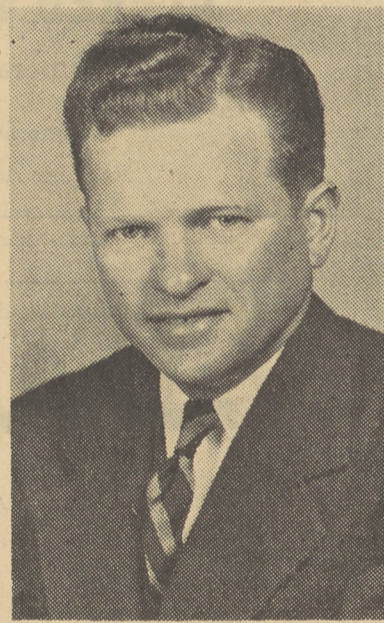
