### Former Alderson Pastor Is Dead

Rev. W. S. York Buried On Wednesday

Many friends and neighbors from the Back Mountain Region where he had served ten years as pastor of the Alderson-Noxen charge attended the funeral Wednesday afternoon of Rev. Welcome Sylvester York, retired Methodist minister who died Sunday night at his home, 641 Westmoreland Avenue, Kingston.

Services were conducted from the home by Samuel Truscott of Dorancton Methodist Church, assisted by Dr. Adrain Foote, superintendent of the Scranton District of the Methodist Church. Rev. Frederick Reinfurt, Dallas, read the scripture lesson and Rev. John Frey of Dunmore offered the prayer.

Services at the grave were in charge of Rev. David Morgan of Alderson and Rev. Austin Rogers of Meshoppen.

Pallbearers were: Harvey Kitchen, Loren Keller, Raymond Garinger, G. A. Shook, Albert Ruff and Alfred Rogers.

Rev. Mr. York was born December 21, 1870, at Arkansas, Wis., the son of William S. and Clara Gray York. He was educated in the home schools and Wisconsin Normal School and was ordained an elder in the Wisconsin Conference in 1904.

After serving four years in the Leon and Tunnel City charge he was transferred to the Northwest Nebraska Conference where he spent 15 years serving at Gordon, Long Pine, Atkinson, Geiring and Hemmingford. He was conference secretary for some years and was a member of the examining board.

In 1918 he came East and joined the Wyoming Conference. He was pastor at Smyrna and Gilford, N. Y. and then came to Noxen and Harvey's Lake, where he spent 10 years at the Alderson-Kunkle Charge. From 1935 to 1937 he was pastor at Bennett Memorial-St. Andrews Churches, Wilkes-Barre serving there until his retirement.

Since then he has resided with his family on Westmoreland avenue.
