A Champion Goes Over The Jumps At Irem Temple Horse Show

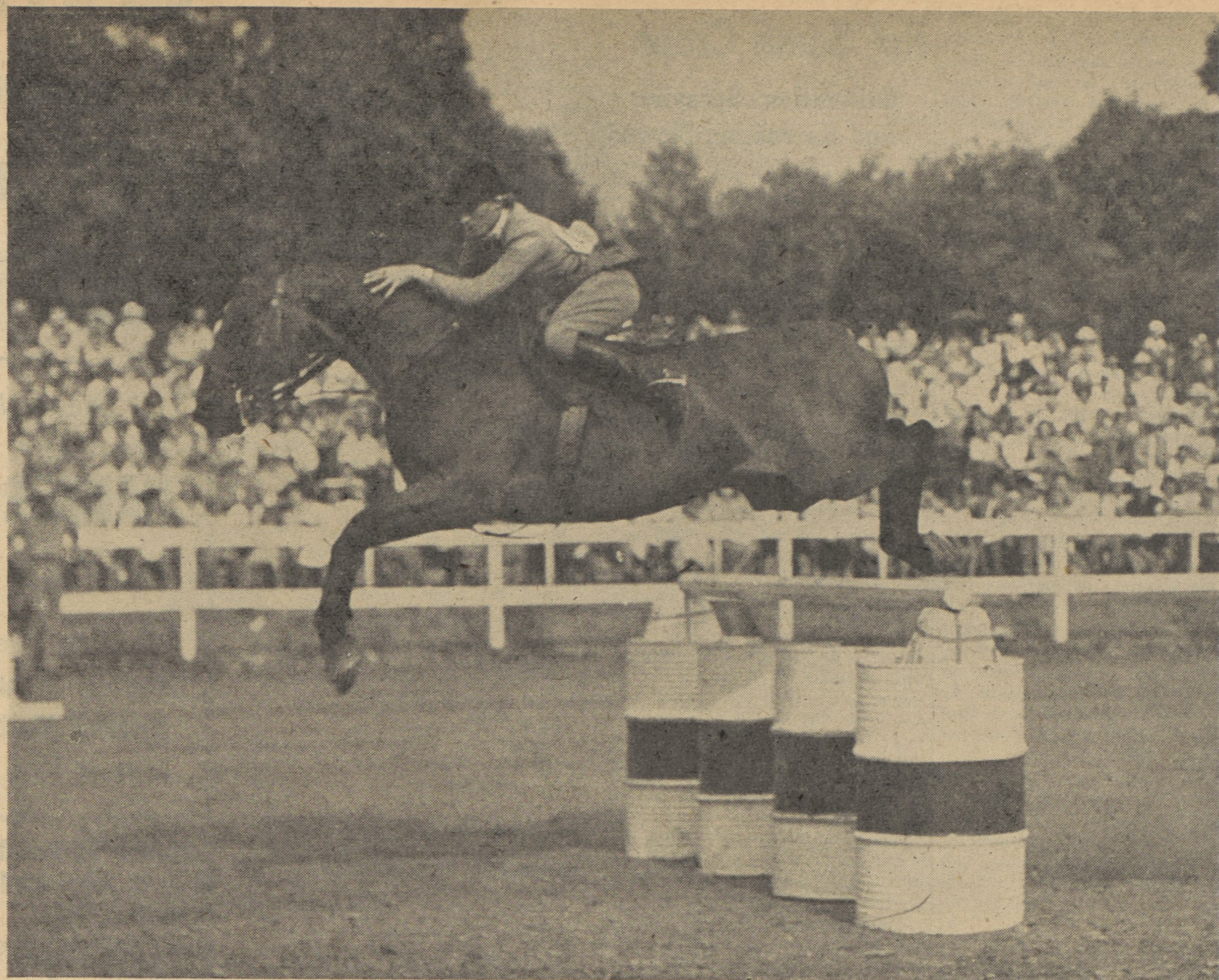

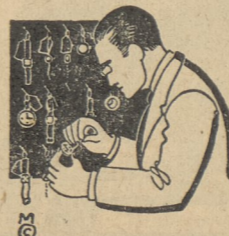

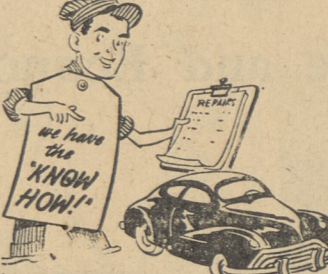
