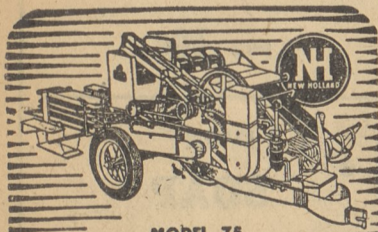

**FOOTBALL ROUND-UP**

Approaching deadlines — KT opens in the Back Mountain with a game at Clarks Summit next Saturday — have sent local teams into a frenzy of preparatory practice. The Katics, leading the local field in practice sessions again this season, defeated a second-year Wilkes-Barre Township team Saturday 23-0 on the home field.

Coach Martz's boys have been laboring longer under the hot sun than either of the other Back Mountain squads. Stiff workouts, including calisthenics, line practice, backfield workouts, inter-squad play and outside scrimmages have the team in shape to make the pilgrimage to the Summit. Proof of the general good shape of the team is the fact that only one man received any injury during the Saturday scrimmage.

In keeping with the Katie policy of sharpening their teeth on big boys, the home forces will scrimmage against the Luzerne Varsity, Saturday. However, the Luzerne squad may find

itself beaten in the weighing-in statistics. The prospective Katie line averages 168 pounds. The backfield holds a two pound advantage.

Joe Mainwaring, Katie faculty manager, who is always good for a story, told us the Katie home setup will include bleachers for 500 spectators and a uniformed band this year. The Kingston field never has boasted bleachers. The band, organized last year under Verus Weaver, has progressed sufficiently to strut its stuff against similar organizations of other local schools.

Something else Joe told us, which

we reported last year but would like to repeat, is that all Katie players are insured under the P.I.A.A. Protective Fund. Following a rigid physical examination, disqualifying any boy deemed physically incapable of competing in the game, players are assured of help in meeting doctor's expenses for any injury incurred in connection with the sport. We'd be very happy to see all local schools follow that example.

**Township Squad Expands**

The perpetual smile on Bob Dolbear's face looked even brighter when we visited the Township this week. Bob was discouraged over the poor turn-out of his squad earlier in the year but resumption of school ended his worries. A total of 27 candidates are out for berths with at least fifteen of them big enough to play regularly. Lehman and KT mentors, snowed under with material, may regard this as slim pickings but the Township has prospered under similar conditions for years.

With two weeks to go until game time, coaches Rosser and Dolbear are not bearing down too hard on their boys, giving light workouts as much as possible under the hot sun. However, the boys will get a taste of real competition Saturday when they entertain the Edwardsville team for a practice game. Tentative plans also call for a scrimmage with the Plains freshman squad but no date has been set for the tussle.

**Big Squad at Lehman**

Tony Marchakitus, spending his first year at Lehman, has a record turn-out of candidates to help him through his freshmen period. An average of 40 candidates has been on hand these hot evenings with a large group learning tricks of the line from capable Bob Martin. Tony personally guides a squad large enough to form two backfields.

The backfield, with Major, Kern, Lloyd, Naugle, Walters, and Charles Nuss, all of whom saw action last season, is the bright spot of the team but Tony is looking farther ahead than this year. "We've only got two seniors with us," he confided, "Next year should be the real season."

If enthusiasm can be counted Lehman should be very much more in the running this year than it was last. Wednesday afternoon, under the beating sun, the Lehman backs put on a real demonstration of fast, hard blocking, pointing up Tony's remark that every man would be a blocking back. We saw more enthusiasm at Lehman than we've seen at either KT or Dallas Township so far, and the League looks evenly matched for the coming season.

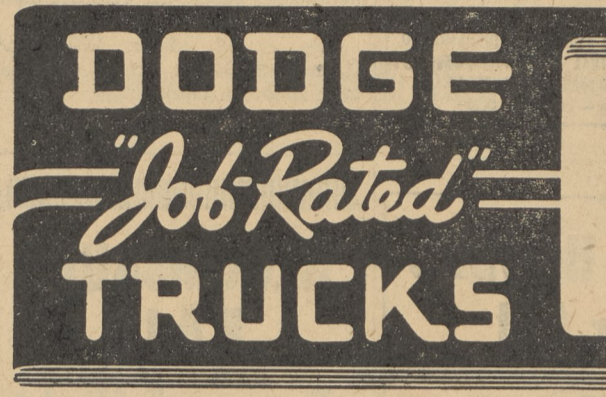

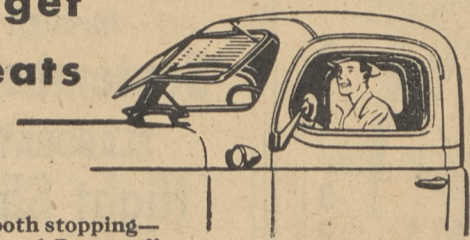

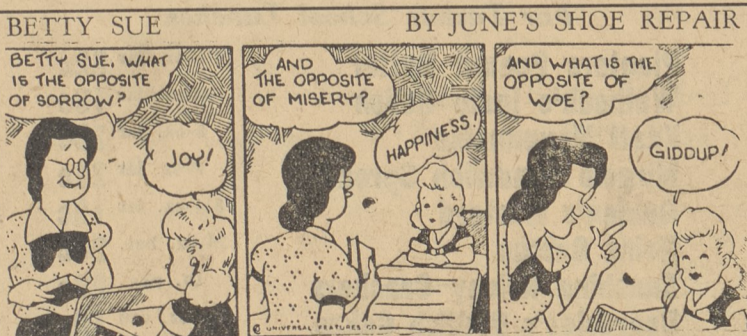
