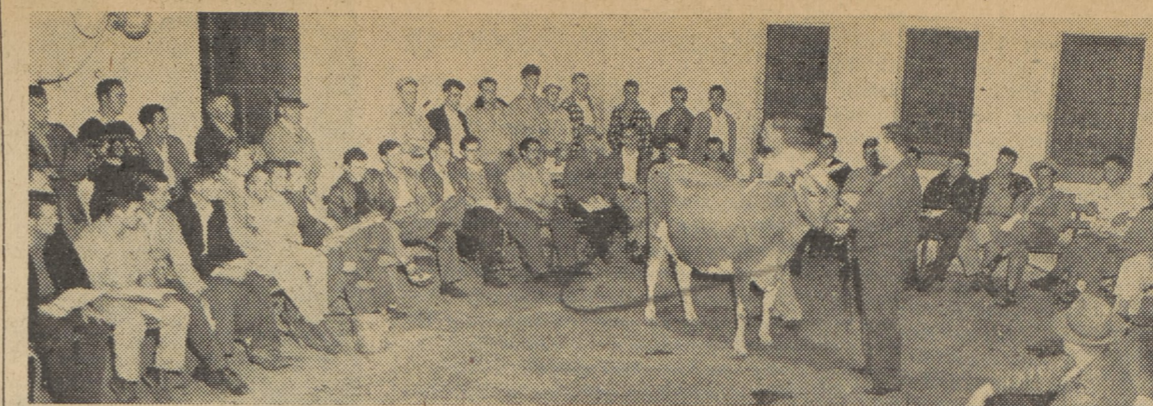

Veterans Visit Farm (Continued from Page One) farm which is fully equipped and is of a size and quality that will be satisfactory for his training. If owned by the veteran, it must be productive enough to insure an income sufficient under normal conditions for a reasonable living at least by the end of the training period. The veteran is assured control of the farm at least until the end of his course. Another requirement is that the course meets the particular needs of the veteran in the type of farming for which he is training for proficiency in planning, producing, marketing, management, and record keeping.
