Next Tuesday Tax Deadline

Personal Property Return Is Expected To Be Large

Next Tuesday is the deadline for filing personal property tax returns with Personal Property Tax Division at the Courthouse.

Indications this week were that returns will be larger than in previous years.

A new law gives county taxing authorities the right to examine books, papers and records of any resident in order to verify accuracy of returns. The act further stipulates, "Every resident is hereby directed and required to give the Board of Revision of Taxes, or the County Commissioners, the means, facilities and opportunity for such examinations and investigations as are hereby provided and authorized."

The act also provides that the board of commissioners may examine, under oath, any person concerning property which was or should have been returned for taxation, and to this end may compel production of books, papers and records and the attendance of all persons, whether as parties or witnesses, who believe they have knowledge of such property.

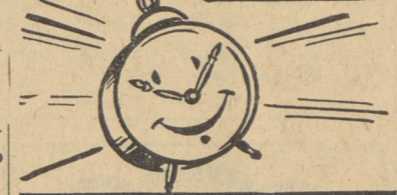
