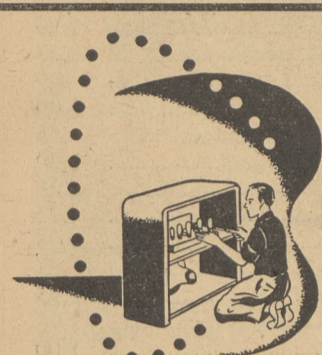
American Kennel Club Approves Mrs. Cottle

She has a breed-wide reputation as a student of pedigrees and "family"

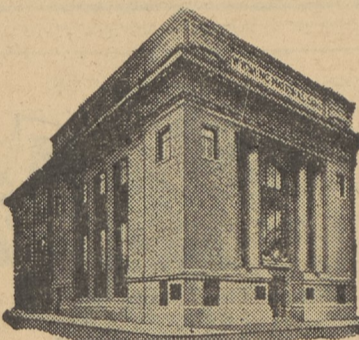
