celebration at Girard College. Rev. Hilbert was a member of the June class of 1920. The Founder's Day program was a gala affair. Ball games were played between the students and the Alumni members. A picturesque parade of the various Alumni groups called forth a great deal of favorable comment. A beautiful service and concert was given by the college choir and the band, in the million dollar chapel of the school. This was followed by a drill parade of the Girard College Cadets, and was command-
