2 tablespoons mustard seed 1 teaspoon turmeric 1/2 tablespoon celery seed 1 piece horseradish

delicious pickles are everybody's favorite. Most homemakers say Soak cucumbers and onions (separately) 5 to 10 hours in they can never put up enough to last through the winter but they always try! So get a big supply brine made by dissolving one-half cup of salt in one-half gallon cool water. Drain well. Add onion, of cucumbers and use this tested 2½ cups vinegar, and 2½ cups recipe from the Ball Blue Book water to the cucumbers. Simmer to make Bread-and-Butter Chips about 15 minutes. Do not cook until soft. Drain. Discard liquid in which scalded. Make sirup by boiling the sugar and spices with three cups vinegar and one cup water for five minutes. Amateurs Will Exhibit At Trucksville Show


