The Lewises have one daughter, Mary, at home.

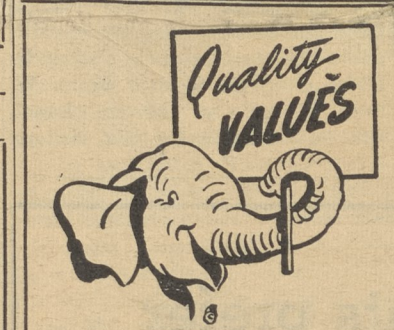
