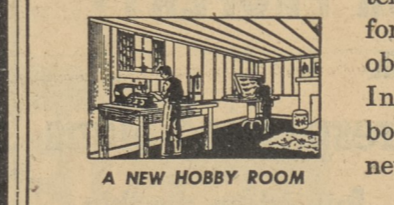

The December meeting will be held at Luzerne Methodist Church with Luzerne local as host. Refreshments were served and games played. The meeting was well attended.



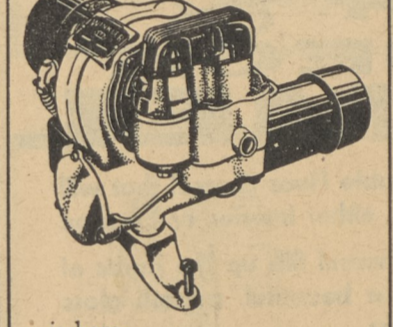
