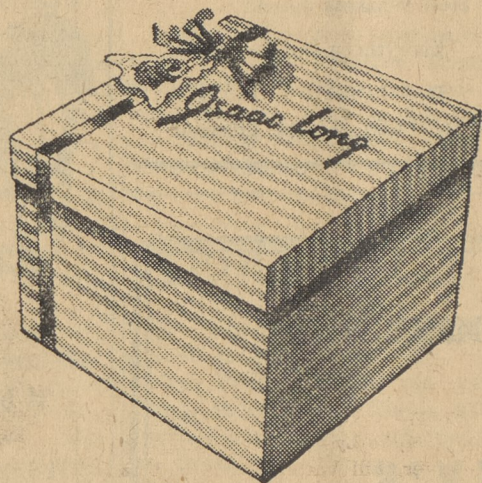

RADIO NEWS

Storing a radio set can be costly to you for it is during long periods of non-use that moisture collects and oxidation in its various forms takes place. It is best to remove the batteries from the set and store both where it is dry and warm. Some batteries do not have their cardboard containers sufficiently impregnated with wax and the paper acts as a moisture absorbant. This is the reason for separate storing. In the case of those sets or record players left at the cottage, well, it would be better to bring them in for the winter and try to use them a little bit now and then; if not that, store them where it is dry and warm.
