Dear Editor:
Is there any pressure which can be brought to bear upon the bus company serving Dallas to change a recent ruling as to discharging passengers in Wilkes-Barre?

Town-bound passengers have the choice between alighting at the Hotel Sterling, halfway down the block, and walking two extra blocks to reach the square, or of staying on the bus for five more minutes and being put off at the Bennett Building. For a time after the re-routing of the Dallas busses to avoid traffic jams on crowded streets, the motormen allowed the incoming passengers to stay on the bus until the end of the run directly in front of Pomeroy's. This allowed passengers to run for nearby shelter in case of stormy weather and eliminated a walk of considerable distance with no protection.

Discharging passengers at Pomeroy's would probably be hard to do in the face of on-rushing homegoers; but it could be managed, even in rush hours. The bus company is in business to serve the public acceptably, and the arbitrary discharge of passengers at point far from the shopping center of town is not acceptable because it is not necessary.

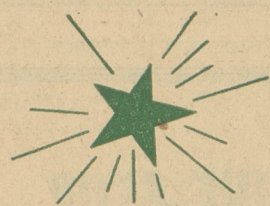
