

Farm Show Tid-Bits

First calf born at the 33rd Pennsylvania Farm Show was a male milking shorthorn which arrived at 4:45 Saturday afternoon about an hour after the dam, Lady Dolly reached the big dairy barn. She was rushed to the livestock hospital maintained by the show, in charge of registered veterinarians who are on call for treatment of all livestock at the Farm Show.

Ten departments of Pennsylvania State Government have set up educational exhibits at the Farm Show. They fill the first and second concourses of the large Arena building. Departments represented include: Agriculture, Commerce, Forests and Waters, Game Commission, Health, Highways, Labor and Industry, Public Instruction, Turnpike Commission and Welfare. The Pennsylvania State College Agricultural Exhibit is in the main exhibition hall.

Many of the 150 Pennsylvania farm operators who have been designated at "Master Farmers" by the Pennsylvania Farmer magazine will attend their annual luncheon this week at the Penn Harris Hotel. Six new Master Farmers will be named, each receive a gold medal from Field Editor Norman Reber.
