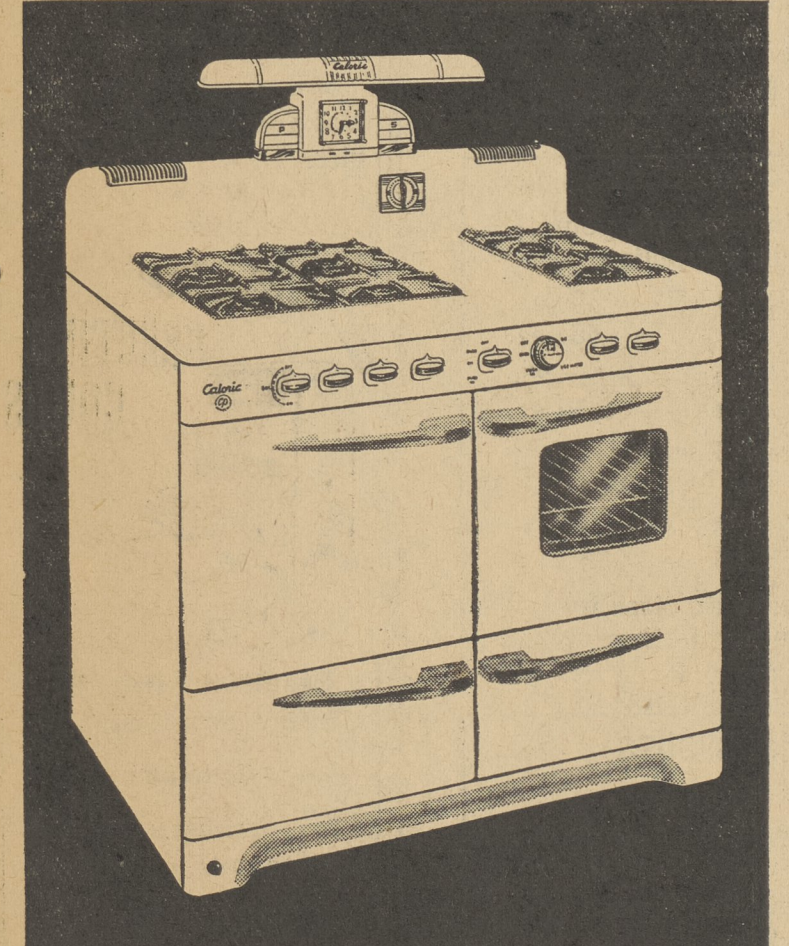

Legal—

NOTICE IS hereby given that the Board of Township Supervisors of Dallas Township, Luzerne County, Pa., on February 2, 1949, duly enacted an ordinance entitled

"An ordinance to issue bonds of Dallas Township, Luzerne County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the sum of \$9,000.00 for the purpose of providing funds to purchase road machinery, dump truck and/or road grader; to approve the form of bond; and to provide for the assessment, levy and collection of a tax to pay the interest and taxes covenanted to be paid thereon and the principal at maturity."

The following is a summary of said ordinance:
The indebtedness report recited the fact that the net electoral and non-electoral debt of Dallas Township, including the debt to be incurred, did not exceed two per centum of the assessed valuation, and did not exceed the constitutional limits.

Section 1 authorized the issuing of bonds in the amount of \$9,000.00 for the purpose of providing funds to purchase road machinery, dump truck and/or road grader. Section 2 described the type of bond to be issued, the denomination, numbers, date and fixed the rate of interest on the bond at two and one half per cent, and set for the dates after which the bonds could be called, the method of giving notice thereof and the terms upon which such bonds may be called and recited the period of usefulness of the property and improvements for which the bonds are to be issued. Section 3 pro-

vided that the bonds should be issued free of present or future State tax. Section 4 provided for the levy of a tax sufficient to pay the principal of bonds and interest thereon and provided for an appropriation from the general fund to meet the principal and interest falling due before the collection of the first annual tax. Section 5 provided for the pledge of the full faith and credit of the Township for the payment of the principal of the bonds and the interest and taxes accruing thereon. Section 6 provided for the method of execution of the bonds, the form of the bonds, the form of the coupons thereon, and the form of the endorsement. Section 7 established a sinking fund. Section 8 provided for the filing of the financial statement in the Court of Quarter Sessions. Section 9 repealed all resolutions and ordinances, or parts of resolutions and ordinances inconsistent with said ordinance.

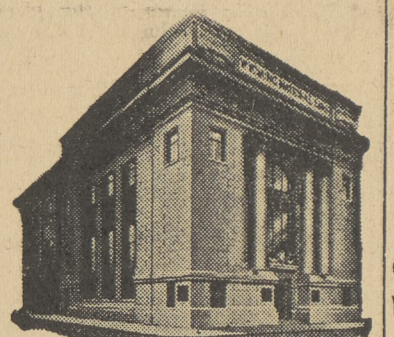

Bertram and Sands Herds Lead In Production of Butterfat

The report of Miss Carol Cook, Cow Tester for Luzerne County Cow Testing Association, for the month of January, 1949, showed that 22 herds with 474 cows in milk and 97 cows dry were on test during the month:

Two cows were sold for dairy purposes and 13 for non-dairy purposes. One cow was purchased.
174 cows produced over 40 lbs. fat, and 77 produced over 50 lbs.
171 cows produced over 1,000 lbs. milk. 95 cows passed the 1200 mark.
