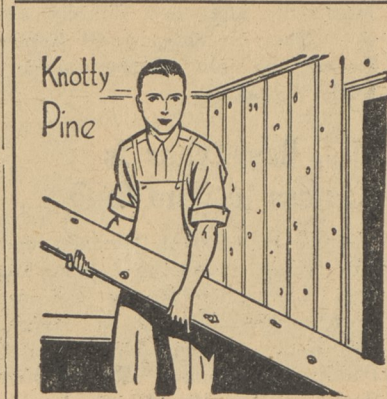
Mr. and Mrs. F. M. Garrahan of Hatfield spent a few days in Dallas this week as guests of the Ralph Roods on Lehman avenue.
