NOTICE is hereby given that the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Lake, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania, will receive sealed bids for the purchase of 11 general obligation coupon Road Machinery Bonds of the denomination of \$500 each, aggregating \$5500.00, to bear interest at a rate to be named by the bidder or bidders in multiples of one-eighth of one per cent, per annum, payable semi-annually on January 1, and July 1. Bids will be received for the entire issue at any one rate of interest, but no bid combining two different rates of interest will be accepted. Said bonds and the interest thereon will be payable without deduction for any tax or taxes, except succession or inheritance taxes, now or hereafter levied or assessed thereon under any present or future law of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, all of which taxes the Township of Lake assumes and agrees to pay. The bonds will be sold to the highest responsible bidder, provided such bid is not less than par and accrued interest.

The highest responsible bidder shall be the one who, having complied with the conditions of sale, offers to take the whole amount of the issue at the lowest interest cost to the municipality, which shall be determined by deducting from the total amount of interest to be paid on account of such bonds during the life thereof, the amount of premium offered, if any, over and above the face amount of the issue.


