To underwrite and distribute the huge issue a group of 390 banks and investment dealers was organzed, and it is expected that distribution in practically every State in the Union will be affected.

While a total of \$500 million in bonds was authorized by means of the Constitutional amendment adopted at last fall's election, it is estimated that requirements will aggregate substantially less than that amount. Proceeds of the present sale of \$375 million should take care of the needs until such time as the final amount can be more accurately determined.

Mailing of the checks to veterans will begin immediately after settlement of the bond issue which is scheduled for March 16.
