Farm Has Had Seven State and Two World Champion Guernseys

Since 1942, Goodleigh Farm, brunges; Fernbrook road, Mrs. worth, Misses Mary Ellen Nulton, owned by Colonel Dorrance Reynolds Howard Garris; Demunds road, Mrs. June Boston, Lorraine Prutzman, and operated by Miss Mary Weir, Frank Nelms; Shrineview, Mrs. Mrs. Leona Jones, Mrs. William has had seven state champions, four Charles Flack; Church street, Mrs. Eckert, Miss Roanna Shoemaker. of them in the past year. Miss Weir reports that one of the heifers from the herd bloodline, Goodleigh Consort Sunola, sold to W. R. German, Starks, Maryland, some years ago, has recently established a world's record for milk and butterfat. It was Goodleigh Consort Mannette who hung up a world's record in 1948.

Another heifer, Goodleigh Romulus Sunflower, sold to W. B. Brooks of Ontario in 1948, has been so satisfactory that Mr. Brooks is now back at Goodleigh Farm to negotiate for the possible purchase of more stock from the same bloodline. He is accompanied by William Nesser, Ottawa.
