Work began yesterday on the relocation and surfacing of one and one half miles on the Noxen end of Legislative Route 65002 through Buckwheat Hollow to Sterling Farm. Cost will be in the neighborhood of \$60,000 and will be done by State Highway Department forces. The narrow, 14-foot highway has many dangerous curves, and Wyoming Valley Motor Club will ask that the Highway Department also include another one and one-half miles which will complete the road beyond Sterling Farm. Senator Andrew J. Sordani has offered to donate all land bordering his farm free of charge for relocation.
