feet thick, and the ceiling paintings had been done with vegetable oil stain. The very ornate altar was carved from Mexican redwood. It was certainly impressive and one had the feeling that standing in the chapel of this cool, darkened structure you could hear whisperings of happenings from as far back as the days of the Declaration of Independence. The bells, which are still bound by rawhide date back to 1779, the same as the altar.
The garden is said to be one of the most beautiful on the coast, and that's not hard to believe. Actually, the garden is a cemetery with tombstones dating back to the early 1800's. Every conceivable kind of flower is grown here, and the gardener takes great pride in his huge dahlias, delicate-colored tuberos rooted begonias, and varied collection of fuchsias.
One evening we wended our way to the Top O' the Mark (Mark Hopkins Hotel) and the Starlight Roof in the Sir Francis Drake Hotel

to look down on the city from these lofty heights. These two hotels were not far from ours, so we walked. The night was very cool and our suits didn't seem like ample protection against the elements as we walked along the busy streets in town. Then we headed up the hills! It seemed easy enough the first block. The center piece of each sidewalk is grooved all the way up to afford a better foothold for the pedestrian. Even that, helpful as it was, didn't prevent us from getting tired out as we climbed higher and higher the next two blocks. By the time we reached our first destination we were glad we didn't have any topcoats weighing down our shoulders.

Chinatown is, of course, a must in this city which features the largest Chinese settlement outside of China. We enjoyed walking along the streets and looking up at signs that we couldn't even read. The shops have strange and varied offerings in ivory, jade, and brocade. The food stores feature dried meats and vegetables that

are foreign to our eyes. Many tourists at the unusual looking candies with apparent relish, but we didn't feel hungry at that stage of the game! We talked with one Chinese shopkeeper for a short time. He informed us that Chinese children go to the public schools during the day, and to Chinese schools at night to learn to read and write their native tongue. The children are perfectly darling, their young parents very modern and well educated, their grandparents lending the old Chinese atmosphere and ways of doing things to the shops and streets. We found Chinatown a friendly, quaint place to spend a most enjoyable evening.
