15 & 16. The Monk and the nun, comforted and secure, confident that they have found the answer in their religion.

17. The atheist, the fool, who grinningly cares not at all, while 18. The stoic, sits in silent awe and contemplation of that which he believes he knows but cannot explain or understand.

To the right of this magnificent work of art is "Baby's Bath" carved by Oreste Andreini. This marble statue depicts a mother lifting her baby into his bath. Baby leans forward confidently as his tiny toes touch the water. He is happy and unafraid, for mother is near, firmly holding him, gently guiding him through this exciting adventure.

The three exquisite figures representing "Melody of Love", by Finelli, symbolizes laughter unceasing, music unending, happiness everlasting. They are the symphony of young love. The sculptor has depicted three graceful nymphs winging their way through time. This is not a solemn, ponderous love intoning its song in mournful cadences, but a gay, lyrical love that sings of hope and joy.

The serene and graceful figure named "Tranquillity", sculptor unknown, suggests the quiet of the evening hour, when the day's tasks finished, the mantle of care is laid aside, but tell of days in goodness spent, a mind of peace, and so forth.

Then on to the statues of a child standing beside his mother. "A child's prayer" it is called. The sculptor, Lazzarini. The little fellow has an expression of askance even though his head is bent and hands folded while his mother reads from the scroll.

Family Group

The "Family Devotion" group is an original by Conti. Here may be seen the father, strong, proud and gentle, protector and guardian of his family. Beside him stands his noble wife, an unselfish helpmate whose love envelopes this group with warmth and happiness. One has only to glance at the expressions on the children's faces to sense the true significance of this work. As we left the court I couldn't erase from my mind what I had once read — "Christ is", as He said, "The Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end". The answer to the Mystery of Life.

God's Garden

On entering a retreat known as God's Garden, created for those who wish to rest in silent meditation and prayer, we were confronted by the compassionate figure of "The Christ". It stands radiantly against the ivy covered garden wall. It is a reproduction in purest marble of the great Bertel Thorvaldsen's famous statue. With arms outstretched, the work is reminiscent of the promise of Jesus, "Come unto Me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest."

Church of Flowers

From here we went over to see the three romantic and historic churches of Forest Lawn; the Little Church of the Flowers, the Wee Kirk o' the Heather and the Church of the Reclusion. Interdenominational, ministering to all creeds, they are regularly dedicated churches. Their only theology is Love. Here more than thirty-six thousand persons have been married. Here little children are christened. Here, when life's span is done, Memory is enshrined. Within their walls, flowers bloom throughout the year and canaries, hiding amid fragrant blossoms, trill litanies of love.

The Little Church of the Flowers derives its name from the masses of fragrant flowers which grow the year around in cloistered recesses on both sides of the nave. The old Bible desk was secured near Stratford-on-Avon, home of William Shakespeare and carved on it is the date of 1660. The 16th century communion table was sent to Forest Lawn from the church at Stoke Poges, where it was placed during the reign of King Edward VI. During this period such tables superseded stone altars in English churches.

The story of the Wee Kirk o' the Heather is quite romantic. I had to know and hear all about it before I left. This church is an exact replica of the 17th century where Annie Laurie worshipped during her lifetime, at Glencairn, in Dumfriesshire, over 250 years ago. The reconstruction was made possible through the cooperation of Brigadier-General Charles Gates Dawes, at that time Ambassador to Great Britain, and John Wilson Paterson, chief architect of his Majesty's office of works.
