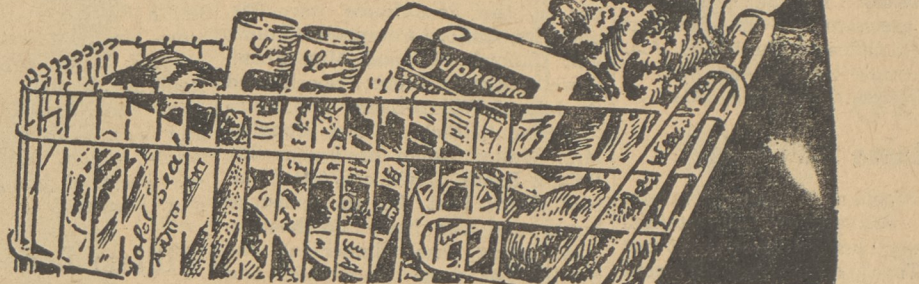

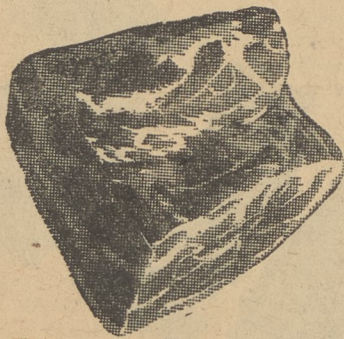

Contracts Are Let For Joint School Supplies

Board Asks Again For Housing Project Plans And Budget

Kingston Township School Board at its meeting last Monday authorized its secretary to ask Luzerne County Housing Authority for a copy of the budget and plans for its Meadowcrest project at Trucksville Gardens.

Those who have seen the printed prospectus of the Authority say that it is so full of errors and omissions of fact that it has probably been withheld from the Board in spite of repeated requests for some information on the project.

The Board also withdrew its objections to the findings of the State Tax Equalization Board after learning the decision of the Supreme Court in the Newport Township Case. If the Board had not withdrawn its objection, the State reimbursement for teachers' salaries would have been withheld for an indefinite period.

In the absence of R. D. Currie, Board president, James Hutchison presided.

The Board also adopted Daylight saving time to start, Monday, April 30, and announced that Miss Clara Cockerille, associate Superintendent of Altoona Schools will be the Commencement Speaker on June 5. Rev. R. W. Edmondson will give the Baccalaureate address on Sunday June 3. Miss Cockerille is studying for her doctor's degree at Pennsylvania State College.

At the conclusion of the meeting, the Kingston Township and Dallas Boards met as a joint board with Dr. R. M. Bodycomb, presiding as chairman.
