

Kingston Township School Board at its meeting last Monday authorized its secretary to ask Luzerne County Housing Authority for a copy of the budget and plans for its Meadowcrest project at Trucksville Gardens.

Those who have seen the printed prospectus of the Authority say that it is so full of errors and ommissions of fact that it has probably been withheld from the Board in spite of repeated requests for some information on the pro-

If the Board had not withdrawn its objection, the State reimbursement for teachers' salaries would have been withheld for an indefinite period.
