

Warmouth's Poem In New Anthology

Dale Warmouth, a Wilkes College freshman from Dallas, has been advised by the Board of Judges of the National Poetry Association that his poem, "Ringneck Pheasant," will be included in a bound volume to be published by the Association in the near future.

This book, which will bear the title, "Voice of Young America," will contain selected poems previously printed in the annual anthologies of the Association.

Warmouth's poem has already appeared in "America Sings," an anthology of American college poetry, and in the Wilkes College "Manuscript," student literary magazine.

The Wilkes student is the son of Mrs. Elva Warmouth of Dallas. He has also had poems published by "The Writer," "Review or Contemporary Poetry," "Epos," "New Athenaeum" and the "American Courier." In 1950, Warmouth received the Anne Hamilton Poetry Book Award, given annually by "The Writer" magazine to the young poet who shows the greatest improvement in poetic expression during the year.

In a congratulatory letter to Warmouth, David Hartman, secretary of the National Poetry Association, said in part: "During the past 14 years, we have published over 200 annual anthologies of

poetry. Among the works contained in these, there are many that are excellent efforts, worthy of being reprinted in a bound volume. Your manuscript, "Ringneck Pheasant," published in one of the annual anthologies, is one of those we wish to reprint."

July 4th Celebration

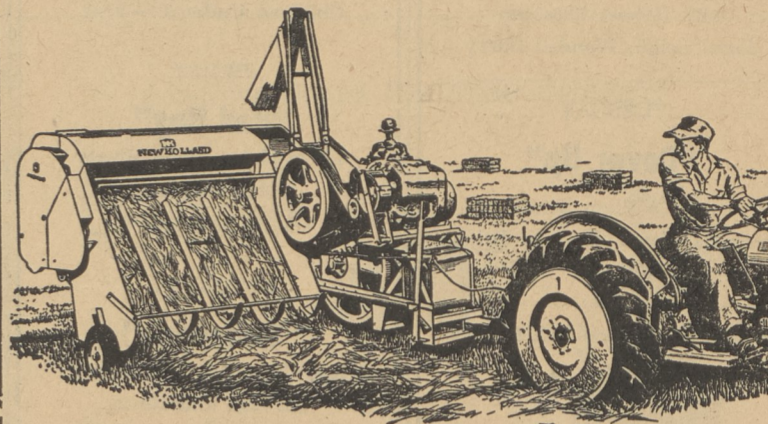
Franklin Township Volunteer Fire Company is planning an all day celebration at Orange on July 4.


