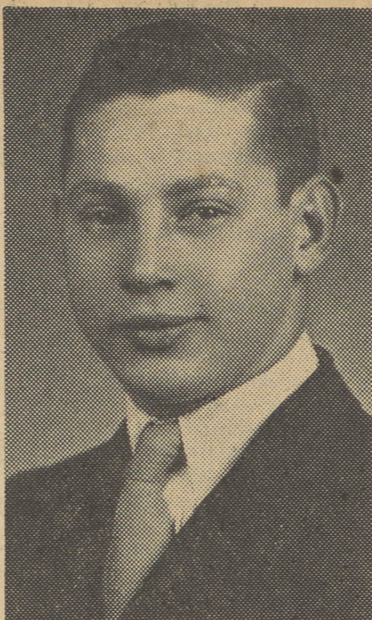
Mrs. Irene Transue Hostess To Joy Club

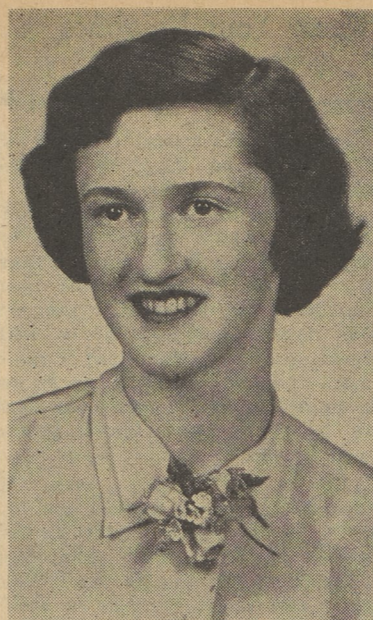

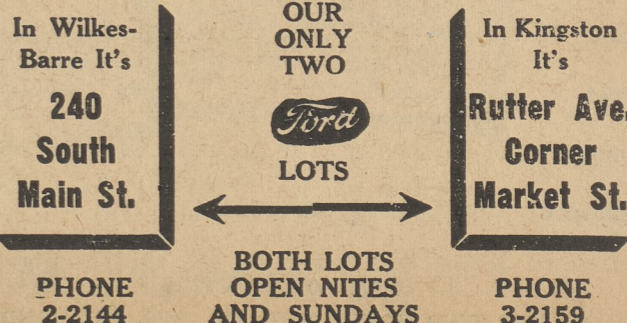

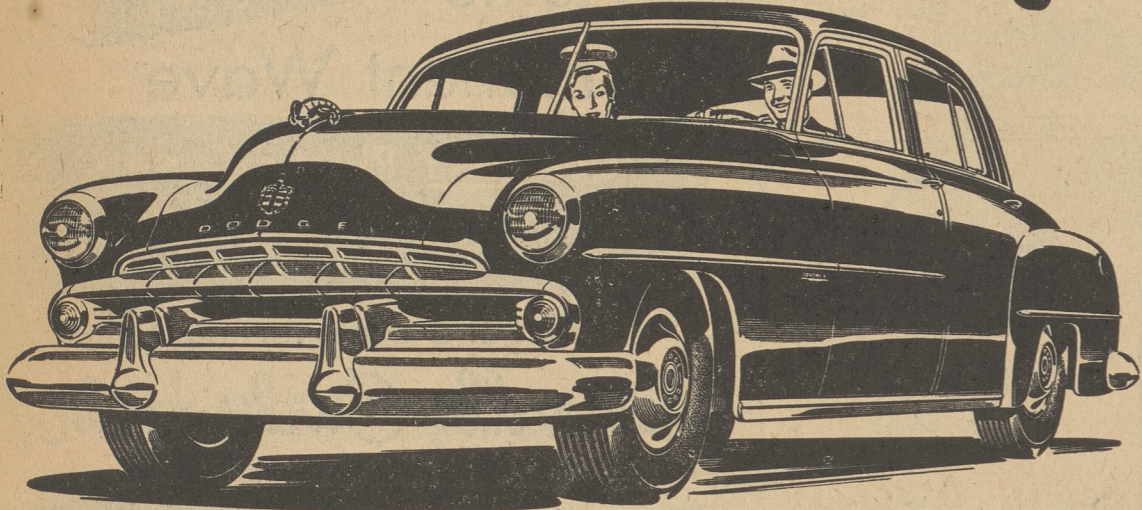
