Kingston Township Blood-types 117

Blood-typing, carried out on an experimental basis in Trucksville, Shavertown, and Carverton, recently, showed sufficient response to indicate that a mass blood-typing for civilian defense records could be undertaken in the future in case of necessity.

Technicians from Kirby Health Center typed 48 civilians in Trucksville on June 12 at the Fire House; 54 at Shavertown Fire House on June 13; and 15 at Carverton Grange Hall on June 14.

According to Civilian Defense heads, it takes only a few drops of blood from a pricked finger to determine blood type. Typing is necessary before a transfusion can be given or received. Much valuable time in case of injury or disaster may be saved by possession of a card bearing correct blood type.

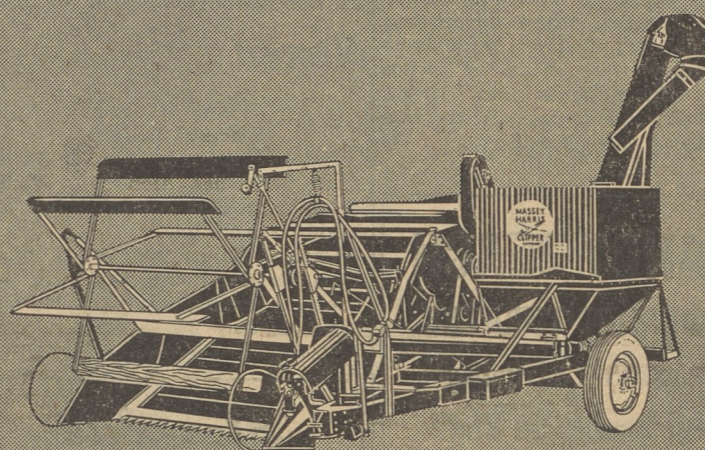

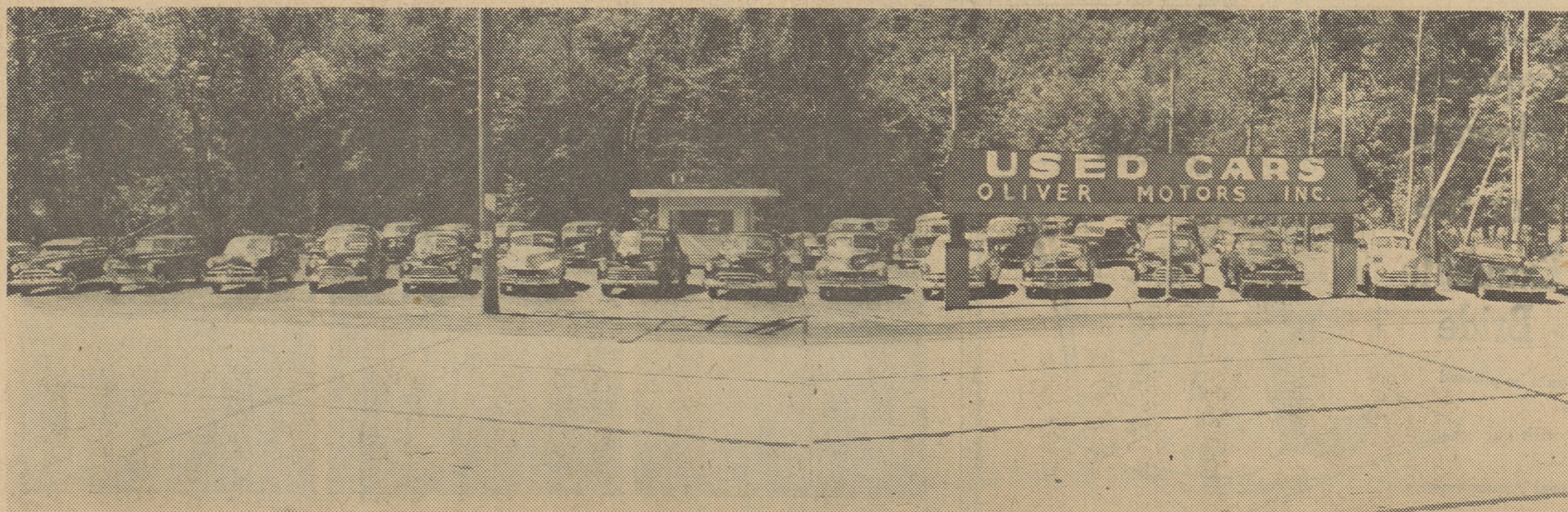
