I drive around eighty miles a I have two regular jeeps equipped with four radios each, and one special built jeep with armor plate for protection against mines. Also one escort jeep with a machine gun mounted on it. The General, his Aide, and a Korean interpreter are with me in one jeep and the escort jeep carries a driver, an aide, and a machine gunner.

A few times a week the General travels by plane, flying over the front lines to study positions. When not driving, my time is my own, just loaf around. Every night at 5 P.M. I go wash my jeep which I use the following day. It has to shine. Then we go swimming. We have a deep river here and it is really nice. Thanks for the Post. Joe Wallo
