A reception at Hotel 2400 followed the wedding and the couple left for Atlantic City. They will reside in Arlington.

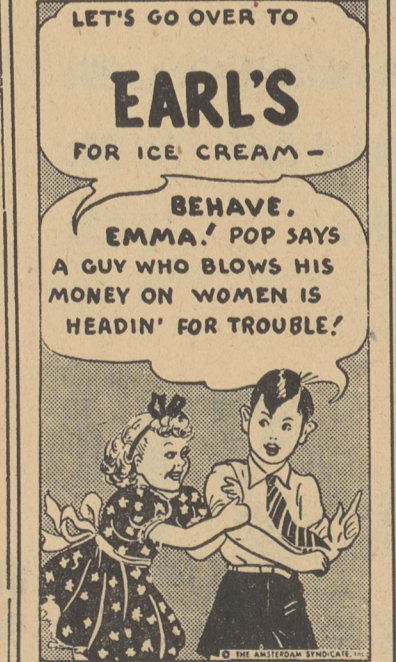
Have Baby Boy
