Several moments of silence were observed in memory of the late Sam Davis.

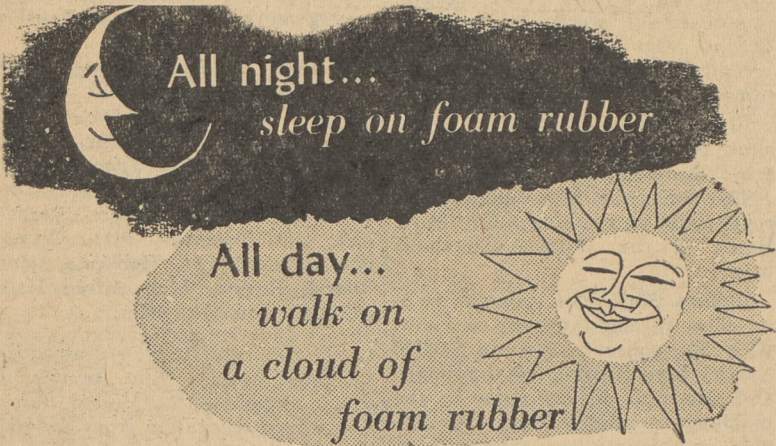
Dana Sickler, president, praised club members for their cooperation and fellowship. Norman Lewis, Carverton property owner, spoke on behalf of the farmers.

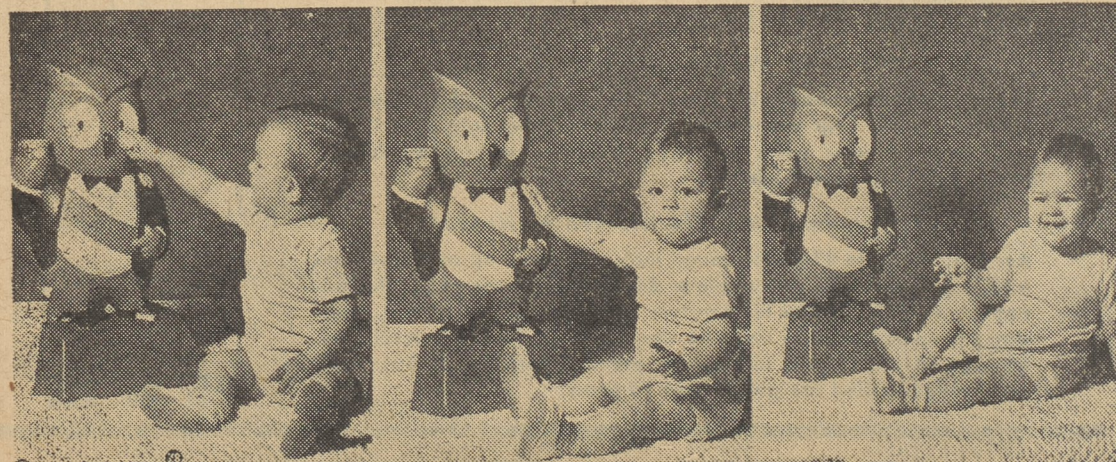
