

Mrs. Hoover Pieces Prize Quilt For Band Benefit

The quilt pieced for the benefit of Back Mountain Community Band sometime in November, is a flower-pot design, developed in bright colors and very handsome. Whoever gets it will be investing in an heirloom. It is made by Walter Hoover's mother, Mrs. Sherman Hoover, Ruggles, who did all the applique work, but called in the neighbors for the quilting bee.

Mrs. Edna Jones, Mrs. Thomas Traver, Mrs. Marguerite Williams, Mrs. Myrtle Kocher, and Mrs. Howard Boice, all experts, gathered at Mrs. Hoover's home for dinner one day late last summer, and made inroads on the quilting. Mrs. Hoover finished the job during the next two days, assisted by one or two of the original quilters who dropped in to help.

Mrs. Hoover at 72 has made and quilted a fantastic number of quilts some of which have gone to New York.

This present model was exhibited when the Back Mountain Community Band played at Idetown in September for the closing program of the summer season.

FARM TOPICS

Feed Roughage—One of the most important parts of any sound dairy program is the feeding of roughage in the winter, according to John Wheeler, extension dairy specialist of the Pennsylvania State College. Good-quality hay should be fed several times each day. Corn silage, about 25 to 30 pounds daily, is another good roughage.

Save the Leaves—Do not burn those fallen leaves. James Dutt, Penn State extension vegetable specialist, urges use of the leaves in a compost pile. Arranged in layers with lime and garden fertilizer and topsoil, and the whole well soaked with water, the leaves will rot and make much needed organic matter for the garden soil.

Feed Beef Cattle—When on full feed a steer should eat not less of the fattening ration than two per cent of his weight, and more if possible, says James Christian, extension livestock specialist of the Pennsylvania State College. Thus, a 1000-pound steer would eat at least 20 pounds of grain a day, and 23 or 24 pounds would be better.

Cull Poultry Flock—Competition is keen in the laying pen. That is why Penn State Extension poultry specialists believe in careful culling. They suggest taking out all birds that are not producing. Some can be given a chance to regain their egg-laying ability. Others should be sold.

To Announce Winners—State winners in the National 4-H Awards program will be announced soon, according to E. A. Mintmier, assistant State 4-H Club leader of the Pennsylvania State College. Some will get trips to the National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago.

Consumers Served—Many services are performed from the time eggs are laid on the farm until they appear on the consumers' tables, reminds Kermit Birth, Penn State extension marketing specialist.

Poultry Club Extends Project For Mexicans

With several thousand chickens scattered among farms throughout Mexico as the result of their project, students of the Penn State Poultry Club voted to continue the good-will project a fourth year. Howard A. Killian, Berwick R. D. 1, student project chairman, said plans are under way to ship 1800 day-old chicks to Mexico during the fall and winter months.

This project began several years ago when Lester Zook, an agricultural missionary in Mexico, visited the campus and explained the plight of the poultry industry in Mexico. The Poultry Club, with the support of many Pennsylvania hatcherymen, began shipping day-old chicks, which Zook distributed to the small farms, mostly from Mexico City south.

Among the series of shipments are some of the best blood lines of several prominent breeds. Progeny from the original chicks can be found, both as purebred stock, and crossbreds mixed with native fowl, throughout several of Mexico's districts, Zook reported when he revisited Penn State during the summer.

Students handle all arrangements for the various shipments, usually made by air express so that the day-old chicks arrive at their new homes at the age of about 72 hours. Quarantine, blood testing, and other necessary details are all handled by the students.
