Following the ceremony, the couple left for a trip to Virginia. They are residing with the bride's

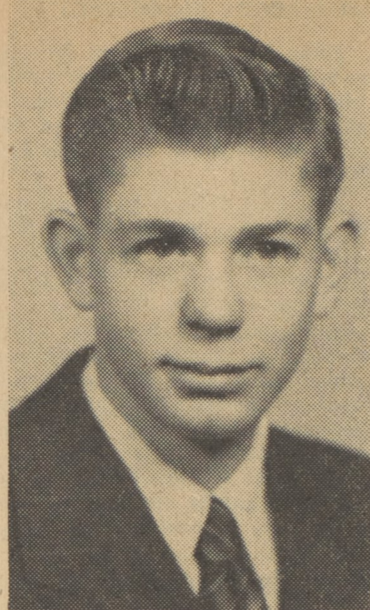
parents. Mrs. Bredbenner is a graduate of Lehman High School and St. Louis Institute of Music. She also attended Washington University in St. Louis.
