Cancer Appeal Being Made By Direct Mail

Back Mountain Aims For Goal Of Two Thousand

Goal for Back Mountain Cancer Drive, as announced by Mrs. Harry Ohlman, area Chairman, is \$2,000. Funds will be solicited by mail instead of personal canvass. The mailing campaign is well under way.

Mrs. William Thomas and Mrs. Arthur Culver will serve as community chairmen.

Mrs. Donald Davis and Mrs. David Hall are in charge of distribution and collection of coin containers, which will be displayed prominently in local business and public buildings.

Volunteers handling mailing are Mesdames Edward Keller, Clarence Butler, Bonnie Davis, Daniel Robinson, L. L. Richardson, A. G. Rutherford, David Jenkins, Clyde Cooper, and Sheldon Evans.

One out of every five of the population will develop cancer, with lung, cancer on the rapid increase, warns Mrs. Ohlman.

Cancer is controllable in most instances if detected early enough. Treatments with X-Ray and radium are better directed.

The great barrier to effective control of cancer is unwillingness on the

part of middle-aged people to have regular examinations, whether from false modesty or inattention to danger signs.

Everything from glass hats to tuberous rooted begonias will be featured. Refreshments will be served.

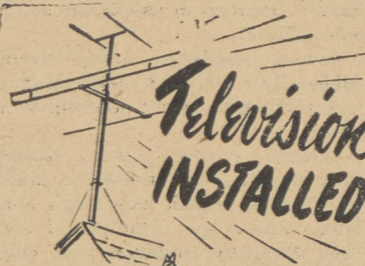
