Mrs. Mary McGarry is honorary chairman, Mrs. Florence Banks, executive chairman, and Mrs. Fredericka Breslin co-chairman.

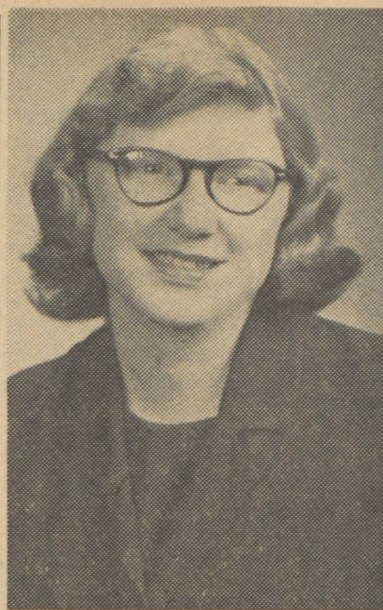
### Lehman-Jackson Seniors Pass Civil Service Exams.
