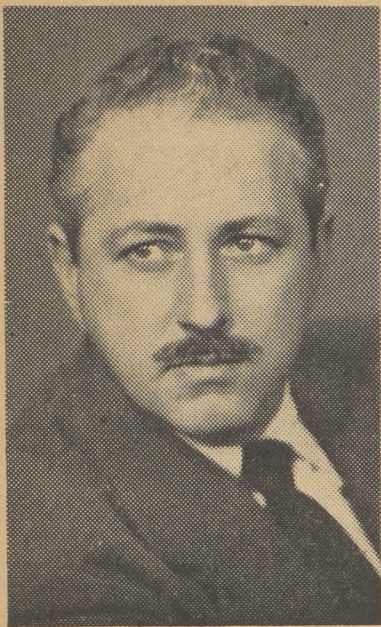


To Talk To Book Club

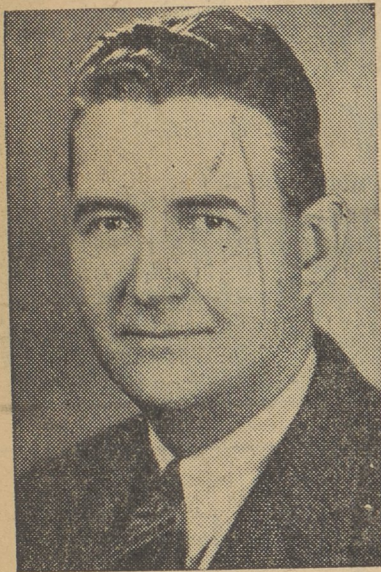
He is particularly known for his seascapes and New England scenes painted during his summer sojourns at Ogunquit where for many years this prolific artist has done some of his finest work.
