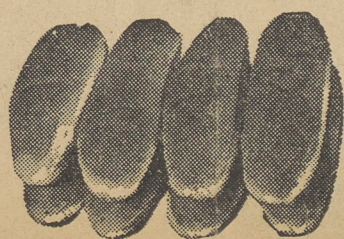

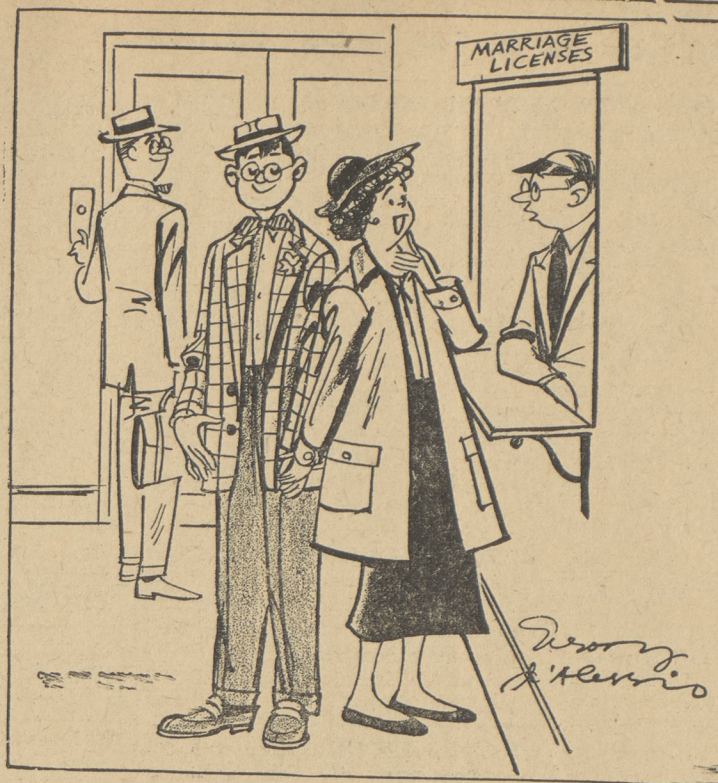

### Police Warn On Fireworks

State Police Will Enforce State Ban

"In view of the number of complaints received and arrests made for unlawful sale of fireworks prior to July 4th, 1951, it was announced today by A. L. Flick, Commanding Officer, Troop 'B', Pennsylvania State Police, Wyoming, that a vigilante check will be made this year to prevent the sale of any illegal fireworks, and prosecution will be made in all cases coming to the attention of the State Police.

"The law defines illegal fireworks as any article using or containing any combustible or explosive substance prepared for the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion or explosion. It specifically names blank cartridges, torpedoes, skyrockets, Roman candles, Daygo bombs, sparklers, or fireworks of like construction except caps, which may be lawfully sold.

"All persons are forbidden to offer or expose for sale or use or explode any fireworks. Provision is made, however, that the governing body of any municipality may grant permits for supervised public displays, so located, in the opinion of Chief of the Fire Department, that it shall not be hazardous to property or dangerous to persons. The license of such display is required to furnish bond of \$500.00 for injury to persons or property as a result of the display. Under this exemption a resident wholesaler, dealer, or jobber, may sell fireworks to a person holding a permit for a fireworks display.

"Violation of the law is a misdemeanor and the Sheriff, Police or Constables, are authorized to seize and remove all stocks of fireworks offered for sale or held in violation of the Act."

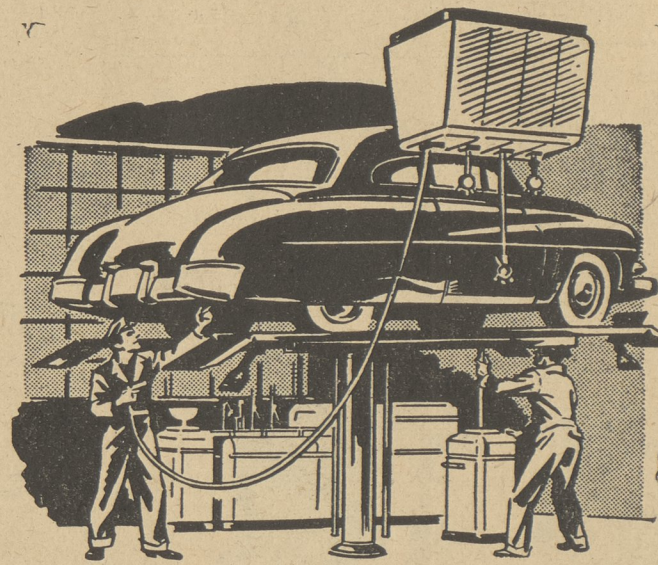
Bess Klinebop was Sunday dinner guest of Iona Holcomb.
