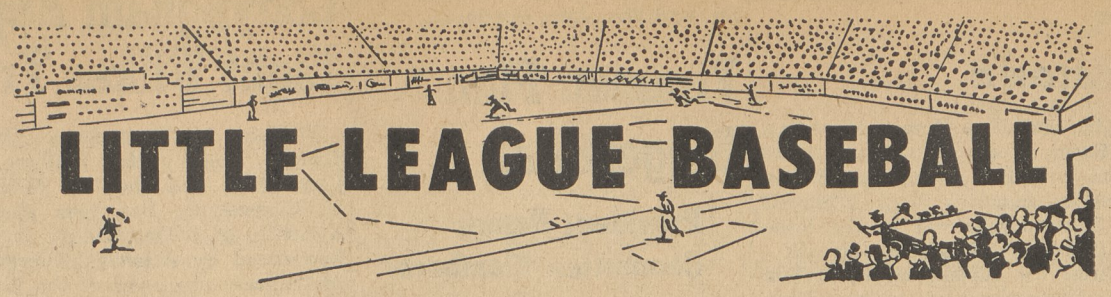

AN ORDINANCE

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Supervisors of Dallas Township at a regular meeting at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, July 1, 1952 at Dallas Township High School building will enact an ordinance extending the Social Security system to employees and officers of Dallas Township.

Said ordinance to read as follows: Be it ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Dallas Township that the considered opinion of the body is that the extension of the Social Security System to employees and officers of the Township of Dallas will be of great benefit not only to the employees of the Township by permitting said employees and officers to participate in the provisions of the Old Age and Survivors Insurance System, but would also be of great benefit to the Township of Dallas by enabling it to attract and retain in employment the best of personnel and thus increase the efficiency of the government.

The 1951 session of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in regular session, enacted a statute, known as Act 491, which is The Enabling Act provided for in Section 218 of Pub-

lic Law 734, 81st Congress, which designated the Secretary of Labor and Industry of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to act as "state agency" to implement the coverage of employees and officers under the said Old Age and Survivors Insurance System. The Township of Dallas is hereby authorized to execute and deliver to the State Agency a plan or plans and agreement, required under Section 6 of said Enabling Act and the Social Security Act to extend coverage to employees and officers of the Township of Dallas and do all necessary things to effectuate coverage of employees and officers under the Old Age and Survivors Insurance System.

The treasurer is hereby authorized to establish a system of payroll deductions to be matched by the payment by the Township of Dallas to be paid into the Contribution Fund of the Social Security Act through the offices of the State Agency and to make charges of this tax to the Fund or Funds from which wages or salary payments are issued to the employees of the Township of Dallas. Such payments are to be made in accordance with the provisions of the Law and regulations promulgated by the State Agency and the Federal Security Administration.

Such payments as are delinquent shall bear interest at the rate of 1/2 of 1% per month until such time as the payments are made.

Appropriation is hereby made from the proper fund or funds of the Township of Dallas in the necessary amount to pay into the Contribution Fund as provided in Section 4 of the Enabling Act and in accordance with the plan or plans and agreement. Authority is given to the president and the secretary of the Board of Super-

visors of the Township of Dallas to enter into an agreement with the State Agency, which agreement shall be in accordance with Act 491 and with paragraph 218, Social Security Act. Such plan and agreement shall provide that the participation of the Township of Dallas shall commence as of January 1951.
