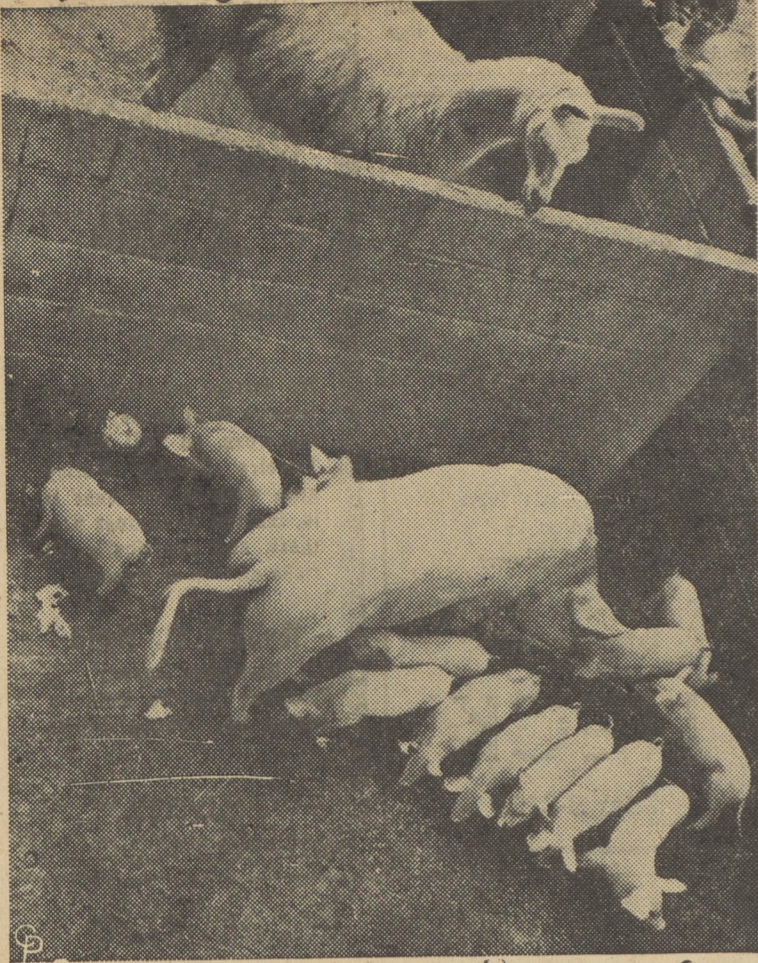


A STUDY IN TABLE MANNERS
