Born in humble surroundings, Mr. Hemelright was principally self educated and was known for his aptitude for hard work and perseverance. At the time of his death he had attained every goal he desiredan enviable character, respect of hundreds of friends, wealth, and the lasting gratitude of many young men and women whom he had benefitted financially.

Mr. Hemelright was born in Beaumont, September, 1870, and passed away in January, 1930, at Scranton, where he had resided for many years. At the time of death, he was president of Peckville National Bank, and a director of the First National Bank, Scranton. He was a member of Keystone Utilities Company, and Sprague & Henwood, Inc., Scranton. His fraternal affiliations were Masonic organizations, Scranton Club, Engineers' Society of Pennsylvania, and the American Society of Engineers.
