CHRISTMAS MAILING

Patrons who will have mail for distant States should mail well in advance of December 11, and mail greeting cards for local delivery not later than December 15.

To assure fast delivery, separate mailings into packages marked "Local" and "Out of Town". "Local Mail" is considered that mail delivered here in Dallas, Pa.

AIR MAIL RATES (DOMESTIC)

The rate of postage on domestic air mail weighing 8 ounces or less is 6 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof. This applies to mail transported by air within or between continental United States. Matter of any class weighing over 8 ounces but not exceeding 70 pounds in weight or 100 inches in length and girth combined, including written and other first-class matter, whether sealed or unsealed, is subject to zone rates. Air mail should be conspicuously endorsed "AIR MAIL".

OVERSEAS AIR MAIL

The limit of overseas parcel post to military addresses are as follows:
Limit of size—30 inches in length and girth combined.
Limit of weight—2 pounds.

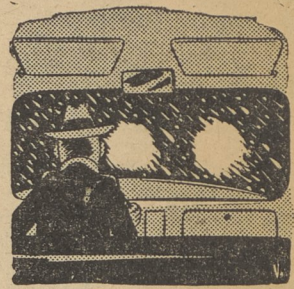
