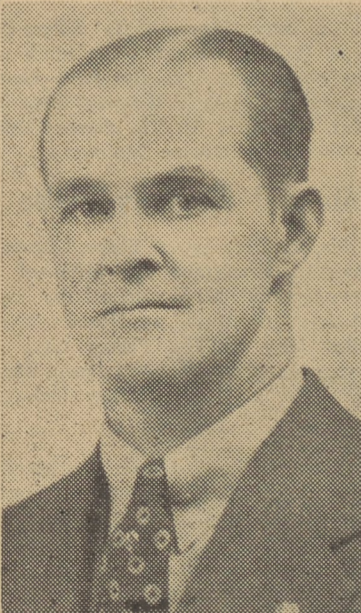

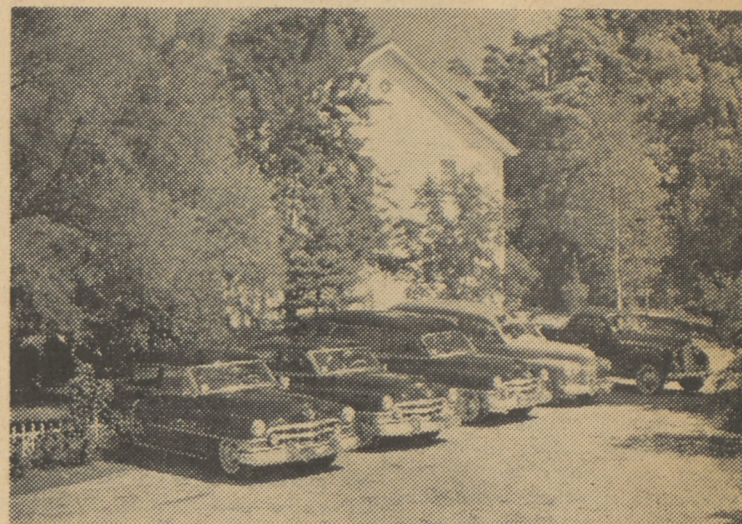
Thinning Your Iris?

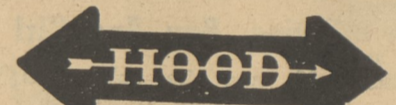
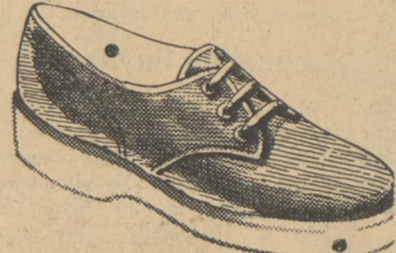
