Rabbit Breeder To Demonstrate

Tommy Andrew, Shavertown, will demonstrate dressing out of rabbits at Pennsylvania State College at the annual short course in rabbit raising, showing the fastest method of cutting and packaging for retail trade and for freezing. He will dress out forty rabbits, the meat designed for the Saturday farewell luncheon which concludes the course for 200 breeders of rabbits.

Thursday afternoon Tommy will talk on problems of selling, how to make rabbit-raising pay, and intelligent use of by-products from fur to fertilizer.

Mr. Andrew has been in business for nine years, keeping a population of 200-250 rabbits at the T-Bar-A Rabbitry, and buying from local Back Mountain breeders for frozen rabbit meat.

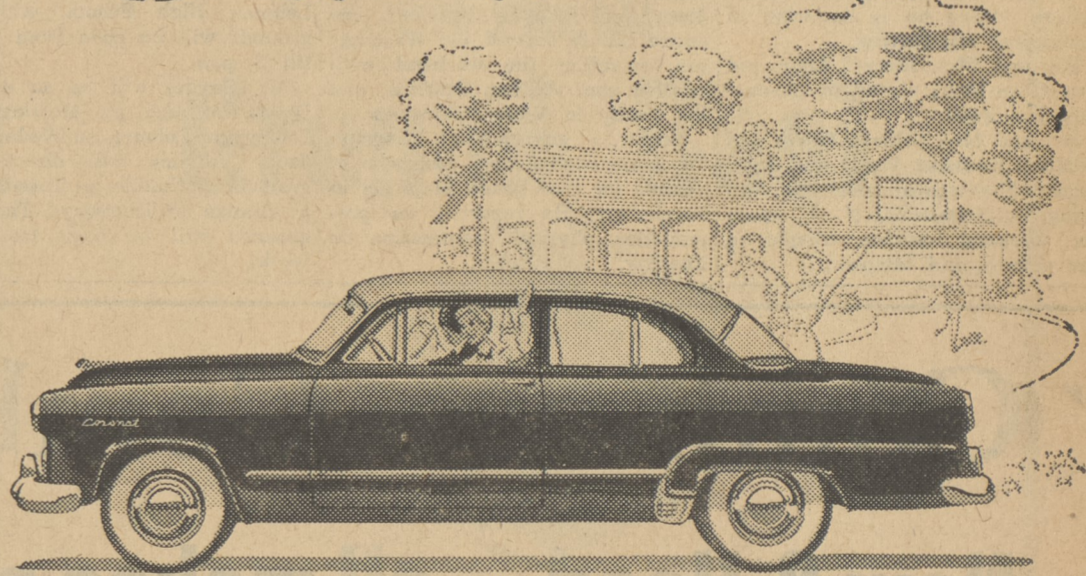
